

Message 3: The Enemy is Revealed

Discussion Questions:

1. Read Revelation 12:7-12. What does this passage reveal about the Dragon (Satan)? How does it describe his strategies and ultimate defeat?
2. Look at Revelation 13:1-10. What do the two Beasts represent, and how do they deceive people? How do we see similar patterns of deception in our world today?
3. In what ways do the forces described in Revelation still operate today? How do they try to pull believers away from faithfulness?
4. Read Revelation 17:1-6. Babylon is portrayed as a seductive influence. What does Babylon symbolize, and how does it compare to temptations we face today?
5. How do we recognize when cultural or political systems ask for the kind of allegiance that belongs to Christ alone? What does faithful resistance look like?
6. How does Revelation 18:1-8 describe Babylon's fall? What does this teach us about the temporary nature of worldly power and wealth?
7. Why is it significant that Jesus conquers not through violence, but through truth? How does this contrast with the way the world pursues victory?
8. Revelation highlights endurance as the way to overcome the Enemy. What practical steps can we take to grow in endurance and resist deception?
9. How do these passages affect the way you think about spiritual warfare and the battle between good and evil?
10. What hope do we have in Christ's ultimate victory over the Enemy? How does this encourage us in our day-to-day struggles?
